

Supplementary Education Funding Agreement

ANNUAL REPORT

June 30, 2023

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1. INTRODUCTION

The Halifax Regional Centre for Education (HRCE) shares a geographic boundary with the Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM). HRCE operates 135 schools serving more than 57,000 students and employs approximately 12,000 teachers and support staff.

The HRCE and HRM share the common goal of creating a healthy, sustainable, viable and welleducated community. This shared vision of excellence provides a framework for the annual supplementary education funding contributed to by the residents of HRM. Supplementary funding has a long history dating back prior to the amalgamation of Bedford, Dartmouth, Halifax, and Halifax County into the HRM in 1996.

Supplementary education funding supports fine arts programming, library support specialists, social workers, and other program and service enhancements for students in communities throughout the municipality.

The current agreement between HRM and HRCE has a term of five years and concludes on March 31, 2024. The HRCE submits an annual report and budget to HRM outlining how and where supplementary funding will be allocated according to the terms of the agreement.

The contents of this report, as defined in sections 8 and 9 of the agreement, include:

8. PROGRAM OUTCOMES

- 8.1 Each year of the Term, the Program shall be evaluated according to the following measurable outcomes:
 - (a) The number of students by grade level and family of schools who have the opportunity to receive enhanced fine arts programming in their classes; (see page 9)
 - (b) The enrollment in optional fine arts programs by grade, age and family of schools; (see pages 9-17)
 - (c) The frequency, range and locations of fine arts performances; (see pages 18-19)
 - (d) The breadth of fine arts programming available across HRM; (see pages 20-21)

(e) The number of students by grade level and family of schools who have the opportunity to receive an identifiable educational enhancement in their school. (see page 9-17)

9. ANNUAL REPORTING

- 9.1 HRCE shall provide an annual report to HRM of the expenditure of the Funding (the "**Annual Report**"), which shall be provided to HRM within 90 days of the end of the fiscal year **beginning in 2021**.
- 9.2 The Annual Report shall include the following measures:
 - (a) a summary of the Program supported by the Funding for the applicable school year.
 - (b) a description of the scope of the Program supported by the Funding, as described in Section 8 of this Agreement; and
 - (c) a budget update, including allocation for the current year and multi-year projection.

The HRCE thanks Halifax Regional Council for their continued stewardship of supplementary education funding.

2. SUMMARY OF PROGRAMS 2022-23

HRCE allocates supplementary education funding into the categories of Halifax Regional Arts (HRA) and Other Enhancements.

During the 2022-23 school year, Halifax Regional Arts (HRA) supported and enhanced fine arts in HRCE through a broad range of learning experiences in the areas of dance, drama, music, and visual arts. Goals for programming included meeting the needs of our diverse populations, understanding our diverse cultural and historical contexts, and exploring new and innovative ways to bring fine arts to the youngest residents of HRM.

All students in HRCE from grades Primary-12 had fine arts enhancements available to them throughout the 2022-23 school year. These took a wide variety of forms, including:

This year, HRA continued to expand programming. Three new Family of Schools Fine Arts Specialists were added. These were allocated to the Bay View and CP Allen Family of Schools as well as a .5 allocation to Musquodoboit Rural Family of Schools, and a .5 allocation to Marine Drive Family of Schools. Two new Regional Arts Specialists were allocated, one with an African Nova Scotian focus, and on with a Mi'kmaq/Aboriginal focus. A Tech Program was initiated for student training and hands on production work. A Tech Support position was added to be available to schools in assessing, assisting, and bolstering existing tech equipment in schools, and supporting school productions in HRCE. A new program was launched to support musicals and shows in schools, with funding, materials, and staff. A percussion specialist was added to the team of clinicians.

A music therapy program for students with special needs was provided in both virtual and in person sessions for 11 Families of Schools. In-person sessions were the primary form of delivery, but in response to different circumstances throughout the year, virtual synchronous and asynchronous lessons were made available so that students with special needs could access music therapy support.

HRA also provided financial support to special projects and initiatives that would otherwise be unattainable for many school communities. All expenses were paid for these experiences for students. Examples include:

- Production of A Comedy of Errors in partnership with Shakespeare by the Sea involving students from 10 HRCE different schools that performed at the first Junior High School Drama Festival and the established High School Drama Festival, DramaFest, 2 daytime matinees for community schools and one evening performance.
- Dramafest access to 12 HRM schools with virtual performances, keynote speakers, workshops, Q&A's, and talkbacks with cast and crew. Over 150 HRCE students participated in

15 hours of daytime programming, and many returned for evening performances and events:

- o Junior High
- o Senior High
- HRCE-Wide High School Musical This production involved 60 students from 13 different schools including rural schools Bay View, Eastern Shore, and MRHS, for over 120 rehearsal/performance hours. Performances were attended by 2500 Audience members of which 2000 were HRCE students for daytime matinees and one evening show. Two shows were fully interpreted by ASL.
- 48 Evening Pottery and Glass Fusion Classes for HRCE Students and Supporters
 - Rocky Lake Junior High
 - Cole Harbour District High School
- Mermaid Theatre virtual access to 55 classrooms across HRCE for over 40 videos on puppetry and performances as well as Duolingo Mermaid TV Series on Mik'maq, French, Gaelic, and African Nova Scotian culture and language.
- Neptune Theatre Virtual Access and Live Performances. HRA sponsored 22 Neptune Theatre Touring Company performances at schools across HRM.
- Eastern Front Theatre 500 HRCE students attended free matinee performances this year of three shows: Love. Peace, and Hairgrease, Frequencies, and Take D Milk Nah.
- Improv Supported 14 schools with fees, coaching support, and production support in the Canadian Improv Games providing students with over 40 hours of coaching each and 5 nights of performance opportunities. This represents 500 hours of rehearsal and performance time for 160 students. HRA also supported the team going to Nationals representing Nova Scotia with accommodations and staffing.
- Unity Charity programming arranged by HRA Spoken word poetry, hip hop dance, and beat making workshops in 11 different schools for 66 workshops involving over 1000 HRCE students.
- Supported and facilitated the Young Film-makers collective at JL IIsley High School.
- Production Support Provided technical support, equipment, and guidance to schools for 22 school productions. This year HRA supported 22 school shows for 70 performances involving over 600 students representing and estimated 1000 or more hours of rehearsal and performance time.
- Provided resources and support to school theatrical productions in the areas of set design, set construction, choreography, and stage management for 22 theatrical productions in elementary, junior and senior high.
- Mocean Dance Provided support for 2 dance performances and 3 workshops.
- Provided transportation for students to attend performances of the Nutcracker.
- Provided funds for local artists to do workshops and performances.
- Organized and supported a series of Hip Hop Dance and Spoken Word workshops in 7 different schools in the HRCE.
- Provided support for schools in creating school wide murals in support of Indigenous culture.
- Provided sound and lighting for holiday and spring concerts in schools across HRM.
- Provided virtual dance opportunities for over 1000 students during International Dance Day.

• Provided support for GSAs to go to Eastern Front Theatre production.

In the category of *Other Enhancements*, all schools in the HRM received the benefit of library support staff during the 2022-23 school year. In addition, supplementary education funding provided for social workers to support HRM students.

3. SCOPE OF FINE ARTS PROGRAMS

In 2022-23, **all students in HRM** had the opportunity to receive enhanced fine arts programming in their classes and in their schools.
